## NOTICE OF NAME CHANGE FROM SALT LAKE COUNTY REGIONAL SERVICE AREA TO OQUIRRH RECREATION AND PARKS DISTRICT

To the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Utah, the Utah State Tax Commission, the Utah State Auditor, the Salt Lake County Clerk, the Salt Lake County Recorder and the Salt Lake County Assessor:

Notice is hereby given in accordance with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. § 17A-1-204(3) as follows:

- 1. By adopting Utah Code Ann. § 17-50-103(2)(b), the legislature mandated that, without the consent of the local county, a special district may not use the word "county" in its name after January 1, 2005.
- 2. By adopting Utah Code Ann. § 17A-1-204, the legislature provided a mechanism that may be used by a special district to change the name of the district.
- 3. As required by Utah Code Ann. § 17A-1-204(3)(a)(i) the Board of Trustees of the Salt Lake County Regional Service Area (the "Service Area") (which was known as Salt Lake County Service Area No. 1 prior to its reorganization as a regional service area pursuant to the provisions of Title 17A, Chapter 2, Part 18 of the Utah Code) held a public hearing on the proposal to change the name of the Service Area to "Oquirth Recreation and Parks District."
- 4. No negative comments regarding the proposed name change were received at the public hearing. Consequently, the Board of Trustees adopted a Resolution dated September 15, 2004 approving the name change to "Oquirrh Recreation and Parks District." A copy of the Resolution is attached to this Notice.
- 5. Upon the giving of this Notice to the officials identified above, the name change from Salt Lake County Regional Service Area to Oquirrh Recreation and Parks District is automatically effective as provided in Utah Code Ann. § 17A-1-204(3)(b) and henceforth the name of this special district shall be Oquirrh Recreation and Parks District as provided in the attached Resolution. Please adjust your records accordingly.
